As always we have had a busy year. We were especially pleased to see an increase in funding for Outreach in Charwood, the family service and IDVA in Rutland due to the high demand for support.
 We were excited to be part of Project 360, alongside Leicestershire Police, the OPCC, the Local Authorities and the University of Leicester. This project is exploring the impact of support on victims of abuse with high police call out rates and the preliminary results report a significant impact from early intervention from a support service.
 This year we were delighted to launch the Donington Half Marathon, an exciting event to add to our fundraising portfolio!
 Finally we were extremely pleased to renew our PQASSO Quality Assessment Mark following a successful inspection and audit.
 A big thank you to all of our staff, volunteers, fellow Directors, partners and supporters for making the work of LWA possible and making a huge difference to the lives of so many people.

This year Outreach and IDVA supported 471 adults and 506 children, to rebuild their lives after domestic abuse.



The City Family Service support 290 children and young people and provided awareness sessions to a further 765 school children.

THE RECOVERY TOOLKIT

Great feedback from the 72 participants on the Freedom Programme(s) and Recovery Toolkit(s) that ran this year.



Four new volunteers and five new counsellors recruited to support survivors.



Supported 54 victims of abuse to increase the security of their homes through Sanctuary Schemes in Charnwood, NW Leicestershire Rutland. Improvements included smoke alarms, letter box locks and letter box fire bags, door and window locks, and alarms.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS DURING THE YEAR



The Phoenix Group ran a self-defence programme to increase safety and confidence with survivors



Working with local partners, including Leicestershire Police and Leicester University, we piloted a rapid response support service for repeat victims of domestic abuse. The pilot, called Project 360, achieved fantastic results and the service has been extended.
